## Description

This three-part, interdisciplinary project encourages connections between language, history, art, and music. By conducting research, designing a presentation, and creating their own art pieces, students will, by the end of the project, have an understanding of an important artistic movement, the key figures associated with the movement, and the social-historical forces that shaped the movement. Through research, designing a presentation, and presenting, students will practice their Spanish reading, speaking, and writing skills. This project was originally designed for high school students in a Spanish IV class, but can be adapted to accommodate the specific learning outcomes for different classes and age levels. At the school where this lesson plan was created, the Spanish teacher collaborated with art teachers to guide student learning. Each teacher assessed students in their own subject areas.

## Procedure

The project is divided into three parts:

### Part 1 Research and Slideshow Creation

Students will pick an artistic or music movement influential in Spain or Latin America (Surrealism, Cubism, Impressionism, Bossa Nova, etc.) to research. They will be asked to identify key concepts, figures, and historical events that are associated with or that influenced the movement. Students will develop a presentation using PowerPoint or a similar slide-show platform.

### Part 2 Oral Presentation

Students will present their slideshows in Spanish. Students will be evaluated based on their delivery and Spanish-language skills pertaining to memorization, pronunciation, appropriate vocabulary, appropriate use of grammar, and fluency.

### Part 3 Art-Piece Creation and Interpretation

After completing their slideshow and oral presentations, students will create their own art pieces inspired by an artistic movement. They will work with teachers in the music or art department to learn and discuss the necessary skills needed to create their piece. Appropriate time should be given for students to gather the information and supplies needed for their creations.

## Assessment

See attachments. Students will receive directions with a rubric for each of the three parts: Slideshow Presentation, Oral Presentation, Art-Piece Creation.

## “Wall of Fame” Showcase

I have a “Wall of Fame” in my classroom where the best pieces of art are on display for the duration of the school year. The “Wall of Fame” contributes to a classroom environment that is student-centered and encourages students’ confidence and sense of accomplishment.

# Representation of different art styles | Spanish 4

This project is divided into 3 parts

### Biography of a Spanish or Latin American Artist that represents the Artistic Movement

- Date and place of birth
- Date and place of death (if dead)
- 4 examples of artworks identifying: (4 x 3 points)
  - the names of the works and year in which it was painted
  - brief description of each work
    - **Emphasize the most important work**
      - Explain its characteristics
      - Name of the museum where the work is located

## II. Oral Presentation | See Rubric I - English-----28 points

- Memorization
- Pronunciation and volume
- Appropriate vocabulary
- Appropriate use of grammar
- Fluency

## III. Your own representation of the style/movement (your own style) \* | See Rubric II----- 20 points

You will create your own representation of the movement you chose:

- Art instructor should be able to identify the style and theme
- Appropriate use of materials
- Time management
- Creativity
- Originality
